

Barney puts 'Wanderer' on wax

IF YOU'RE a regular at Friday's Restaurant on Friday and Sunday nights, then you're sure to know Barney and Friends.

In recent times, Barney — a rhythm guitarist, joined forces with Nicholas Branker of Chamber Engineer, Joseph Herbert, and WIRL. The result was the production of his smashing new record Wanderer. Side "A" carries the title song in full, and Side "B" contains the version.

song in full, and Side D contains the version. Barney, whose real name is Winston Smith, describes the record as having a "reggae groove" and telling a sort of Mills and Boon type story in just over three minutes.

This recording venture is by no means Barney's first. He's been 20 years in the music

business, and has played with bands like the Four Friends and Nite Life, and has cut records with both.

Prior to his contract with Friday's Restaurant, Barney worked on various cruise liners.

In 1982, he was based in Germany, and in Denmark from 1983-1985. Once back in Barbados, after his European stint, Barney wasted no time in getting back on the hotel circuit and also working at Friday's where Olwen Moore joins him on the bass guitar.

"More airplay is definitely needed but I am hoping for the best," he wishfully said.
