Talk Tent doubles up its talent

"AGAIN we have experimented with seeds of a revolutionary nature, by fusing with the positive elements of Stage One Theatre, to assist in bringing about a cultural renaissance."

This is how co-ordinator of the Pinelands Creative Workshop, Rodney Grant views the joint project between Stage One Theatre and Pinelands Creative Workshop, to produce Talk Tent '89.

"Indeed, the twinning of these two unique groups to play as one, is testament of our commitment to foster and develop the theatre at all levels — locally, regionally and internationally," Grant continued.

He, however, lamented that it took so long for us to hold up the Barbadian culture as a proud symbol of our development, but stressed that "culture belongs to living people and is always developing".

The Pinelands Creative Workshop is essentially a community-based and oriented group which con-

cerns itself primarily with the community which fuels it.

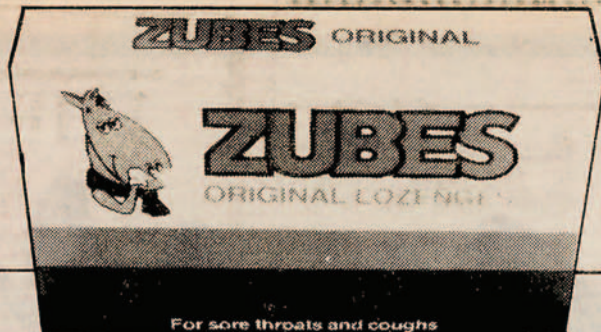
These issues, however, inevitably affect the entire Barbadian society. The solutions thrown up by the group in its theatrical presentations send important messages to all Barbadians.

The group's achievements have been remarkable. It's first production, which was captured on film, reached as far as the Cannes Film Festival. And it continues to strive towards the further development of its own community, and indeed the wider Barbadian society.

It has also taken its social messages abroad on tour, thereby exposing its members to further experiences.

"Our roles in this historical process must not be seen as minute, but must be measured by the tremendous vigour and discipline which is needed to master the system of change," Grant concluded.

The hilarious but telling production Talk Tent opens at the Combermere Hall tomorrow at 8 p.m.
